We as your Parish council will do our utmost to continue in our duties to support and protect our village.

Many thanks to those residents who have returned the traffic survey questionnaire your opinions have been most welcome and the results of these will be published in the next newsletter.

With the evenings getting longer, Spring seems to be in the air now, daffodils and spring flowers are in evidence around the village, birds are singing happily and the mad March hares and rabbits are enjoying some welcome sunshine including ourselves. I would like to wish all our residents a happy Easter and to all our younger members I hope the Easter bunny hops by.

## Bretherton War Memorial Repair and Refurbishment

During the Great War, now known as World War 1, and World War 2, the village of Bretherton lost 16 of its men folk; they made the ultimate sacrifice for their country and the free world. Without their sacrifice and that of approximately 36 million military personnel, there can be no doubt that the current people of Bretherton and of Great Britain, would not enjoy their current freedom and lifestyle, which we take for granted. The men folk of Bretherton who made the ultimate sacrifice are remembered and honoured through the Village War Memorial.

The words said on Remembrance Sunday throughout Great Britain are *"They shall not grow old, as we that are left grow old. Age shall not weary them, nor the years condemn. At the going down of the sun and in the morning, we will remember them."* are also relevant to the village War Memorial completed and consecrated in 1922. The men it remembers and honours will never grow old, but the memorial has grown old, now in its 94<sup>th</sup> year it is showing its age, it is in need of some total loving care, by which is meant repair and maintenance.

Your Parish Council recognises the need for such works in order that the War Memorial will continue its 'life', in a fitting state to remember and honour the men folk of Bretherton who gave their lives, this to be achieved no later than September 2018. It further recognizes that the extent of the works required need to be identified, from this their costs and finally the funding of them. With all of this in mind it has made applications to the War Memorial Trust, who, subject to approval provide grant funding of 75% for investigatory and 50% for approved identified works.

The difference between the amount of grant and the works costs being met by your Parish Council. Currently it has sought, and obtained financial commitments totaling £750 from Chorley Borough Council which will be added to by your Parish Council through its financial reserves and from the Council Tax Precept for the next three years.

Unfortunately it is most unlikely that this funding will meet the anticipated cost, particularly those of the identified works approved by the War Memorial Trust. Therefore, it falls to your Parish Council and you the Bretherton residents who fund it, to identify how the required additional funds might be raised. For this purpose it is the intention of your Parish Council to hold a public meeting during the week beginning 23<sup>rd</sup> May 2016. Please do attend and give voice to your views on this matter, which arguably is the most important to have been placed before you in recent times. An indication of the probable costs involved will be made known at the meeting.

## School News

It has certainly been an action packed term at Bretherton! Class 4 went to Stockport to enhance their World War II topic which included a trip down the air raid shelters in the town. We had a great day again with Prags from Cultural EducAsian. She led assembly on Saraswati, goddess of Learning before the food sessions started! The children made sweets, working in small groups while asking her lots of questions about her culture and faith. Gemma from the School Sports partnership worked with children from class 3 and 4 exploring cultural aspects of sport. The school participated in the first Lancashire Primary Schools Fairtrade Conference at County Hall Preston.

Year 1 and 2 pupils joined their peers from Croston and Mawdesley for a presentation by children's author and illustrator Emily Mackenzie who also read her brand new story and signed and dedicated books. Class 3 had a 3 week eco educational programme provided by Global Renewables which included a visit to the Eco centre in Leyland. Mrs Vincent, Mrs Rowley and Mrs Hudson ensured all our children had a home-made pancake on Pancake Day! It was especially a challenge as we had children out on trips that day – but they did it! They were delicious too! Our Class 3 children were trained to become PALS (Playleaders At LunchtimeS) Class 1 led a lovely worship on Mother's Day. We had a phenomenal 170 guests for our PTFA Mother's Day Afternoon Tea. The afternoon tea raised money for our PTFA, as well as once again being such a lovely occasion. We really enjoyed welcoming our Governors into school. They all had a fantastic time sharing worship with us with Rev. Janet and then seeing our school in action for themselves.

I received the analysis from the Local Authority on the questionnaires our parents completed for us last term. We had no negative responses at all, all the responses were more positive than the project average, and all were in the top 1% of schools involved in the project! We had an amazing 76% returns compared to the project average of just 28% which was fantastic and showed just how much our parents care.

Personally, I am busy training for the London Marathon 2016 in April! I have secured a place running for an amazing charity, 'The Children's Trust', who work with children who have a brain injury, either acquired or from birth.
