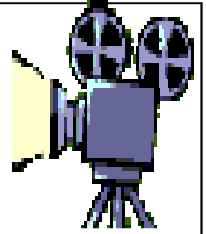

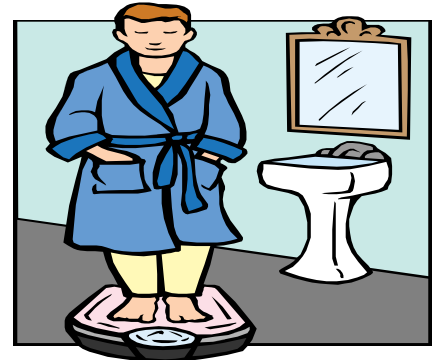

We have had the usual small birds on our feeders all summer (blue and great tits, goldfinches, assorted sparrows) but the long tailed tits seem to disappear and only returned this week.

Three geese flew over today (14 Sept) it seems early for them to arrive for the winter but we should see the usual large numbers arriving next month.

Bank Hall Update – September 2012

As you may be aware, a newly constituted Group “The Friends of Bank Hall” took over running events etc. at Bank Hall from the 1st January this year. FBH is still affiliated to Heritage Trust for the North West but is now a registered charity in its own right and as such has also registered with other bodies. Bank Hall Action Group will remain in existence for the time being.

Filming - The latest filming at Bank Hall took place on the 5th September. Gardeners World were filming in relation to the native Clematis on site. The program, we understand will be on TV early in October.

Main Project - Behind the scenes work continues on sorting out the legal & financial aspects of the project. It is all very complex and we are still hoping that work can commence towards the end of this year or early next year.

Potting Sheds Project - The Friends of Bank Hall are organising this project. A Grant from LEF has been awarded and we are currently awaiting a decision from the Heritage Lottery Fund concerning the remainder. If this is successful, work should commence on these buildings before the end of the year.

Volunteer Days - Monthly Volunteer days have been organised and latterly clearing the Greenhouse area has been the priority. All help gratefully received.

GARDENING NEWS FROM MARGUERITE ⁶

Was I being hopelessly optimistic when I opened my last gardening report with tips on how to make sure your plants got enough water in the summer??? My comment now, on looking back at our wettest summer is don't give up on the garden, use autumn as a time to plan new beds & borders and to plant your bulbs to look forward to a colourful spring. Whilst we've had more rain than we needed it will lead to a very good flowering display on spring shrubs such as camellias & rhododendrons. We are currently enjoying some of the best looking hydrangeas for many years.

Tasks for October

Trees Shrubs Climbers & Flowers

Rake up fallen leaves regularly. Bag up & leave in the garden to rot down and produce leaf mould for the following year.

Plant container grown trees, shrubs & climbers

Lift & divide congested clumps of herbaceous perennials

Plant some new herbaceous perennials to bring colour to beds & borders in autumn

Lawns

Keep on with lawn care including feeding with specialist autumn lawn feed

Herbs & Vegetables & Fruit

Pick any remaining green tomatoes and compost the plant. Putting the fruits in a bowl with a banana will help them ripen

Tidy up strawberry plants

Tasks for November

Trees Shrubs Climbers & Flowers

Prepare new beds & borders for spring planting & carry out autumn digging

Plant bare rooted hedges & shrubs

Lift dahlias if not already done

Take hardwood cuttings including climbers

Continue planting tulip bulbs

Finish planting other spring bulbs

Lawns

Turf new lawns on previously prepared ground

Fruit & Vegetables

Plant new fruit trees & bushes when the weather & soil conditions allow

Mulch around fruit trees with a generous layer of compost or composted bark

Plant rhubarb

Plant & sow hardy peas & beans for an early crop next year

Wildlife Garden

Tidy water gardens removing dead leaves & debris. Thin out oxygenating plants

General

Clean & thoroughly oil all tools before winter

Remove, clean & store reuseable plant supports



Problem of the Quarter - Fungi

Fungi of all types are likely to appear all over the place in the autumn & the lack of frosts mean that many will survive for several days or longer. Most are toadstools that appear in gardens and are not harmful to plants, so unless they are like the ones in the picture!!, there is no need to panic as soon as you see them. If they appear on lawns, just brush them off to minimise their spread, unless they appear in circles or look as if they are killing off the grass

A few such as the tough bracket fungi that develops on tree trunks and the golden toadstools of honey fungus can spell TROUBLE.



Some fungi may cause a tree to become potentially dangerous & even if you remove the fungus itself, the problem may continue to develop. If in any doubt consult an expert.

SNOOKER

The new snooker season has just started and although we have a healthy snooker following with six teams playing in the various leagues, we are always looking to improve and introduce new blood at all levels of ability.

The club's over 60's play in the Preston League on Wednesday afternoons. Astland League matches are played on Tuesday evenings and two teams playing in the Southport and District League matches, alternating between Wednesdays and Thursdays evenings.

The snooker tables are available for use on all other nights with a rack full of cues to borrow. If you'd like a game, please come along or get in touch.

We have just completed a very enjoyable summer snooker competition between 17 of our members. All players were given a reasonable handicap and Ronnie Dickinson was finally crowned as champion after winning 13 of his matches.

Bretherton Awarded Sport England Grant



The Parish Council in conjunction with Bretherton Bowling Club, have been awarded a grant of £50,000 to build a new Bowling Clubhouse. The grant is part of Sport England's Inspired Facilities programme, the aim of which is to ensure that the benefit of the Olympic legacy is shared by all sports and communities nationally. Discussions are currently taking place with the Sport England appointed contractor to finalise the detailed design of the building which will be manufactured at their factory in Belfast and installed on the site of the existing Bowling Cabin early next year. It is hoped that the new facility, which will include an accessible toilet, kitchen and social area will be ready for the start of the 2013 season.

Much of the work on the project will be done by members of the Bowling Club and it is hoped that the facility will also be used by other groups in the village for meetings and other small scale events. For more information please contact John Pigott on 01772 601455.

Multi-sports plan for Bretherton Recreation Ground.



As reported in our last newsletter, the Parish Council is investigating the possibility of developing the tennis court area into a Multi Use Games Area (MUGA). The development would include the renewal of the surrounding fence and the creation of an all the year round facilities for tennis, football, basketball, netball and other games.

The existing tennis net would be replaced by a solid "net" which would also divide the area into two pitches for other sports. It is probable that tennis would have priority between April and September when the grassed areas are in good condition for other sports.

It is hoped that the project can be funded from external sources.

During the next few weeks we will be carrying out a survey of young people in the area to collate their views on the detail of the new facility. We would also like to hear from any other users and parents who have views on the proposal. If you have any thoughts on the proposals, please contact ;
