### **Burglaries**

Bretherton has been subjected to its second "professional" burglary in the last several months, with thieves spending many hours in a house, systematically going through all the contents. So now would be a good time to think about 'beefing up' your security, remembering not to leave door and windows open, fitting 5 lever mortice locks on doors, ensuring that all windows have locks and installing an approved alarm system and maintaining it. You can also help by keeping your eyes and ears open. Be vigilant. You cannot stop a determined burglar, but you can make it a lot more difficult for him or her. Finally, please check on those in the village who fall in to the category of being more vulnerable and who might need your assistance."

## North Road Speed Limit

As part of the Parish Council's efforts to improve road safety on North Road, Lancashire County Council staff have been reviewing data from our SpID, as the possible justification for the introduction of a 30 mph speed limit between Carr House Lane and Canal Leach. Despite evidence of significant excess speeding by vehicles, we have been told that there was insufficient justification for additional speed enforcement, based on the combined speed and casualty data and the Lancashire Police Force's finite resources.



The Parish Council are disappointed in this decision and are asking the County Council to consider other measures to improve road safety such as the provision of double white lines at the junction of North Road with Pompian Brow, where there was a fatal accident two years ago.

## BANK HALL UPDATE ;

We held our Classic and Vintage Car Rally at the end of July and once again this was very well supported by over 700 visitors and 130 vehicles which came to the event. An increase on last year. Thanks go to exhibitors and the sponsors, Cross and Watson.

**BIRDS IN BREHERTON** The birds have taken advantage of the good summer, but now the weather has changed, small flocks of geese have been arriving. There have been several young tawny owls exchanging calls so they seem to have bred well this year. We have had a swallow's nest for the first time for several years and they successfully bred 5 chicks. The food on our feeders has disappeared very quickly and a newcomer this year is a bullfinch. Birds of prey seen are the now fairly common buzzards and kestrels but later in the year two red kites have been seen towards North Road and also a merlin was seen last month. ## **GARDENING NEWS FROM MARGUERITE**

Autumn has arrived and with it comes the promise of spectacular autumn foliage. If you want to guarantee a blaze of colour and interest in your borders in autumn with some hardy & trouble free plants, these are my top six -

Sorbus (vilmornii is one of the best)

Hamamelis (witch hazel)

Euonymus Alatus Compactum

Fothergilla

Liquid Amber

Cotinus ( smoke bush)

If you are considering buying an apple tree, old heritage varieties are very robust and generally produce fruit that stores well. I would recommend;

Ashmeads Kernal, Kidd's Orange Red, Blenheim Orange

### **Garden Jobs for Autumn**

Plant clematis, other climbers and spring bulbs, leaving Tulips until November

Sow sweet peas

Carry out autumn maintenance in the borders, cutting back, tidying and mulching but leave tender perennials and seed heads for autumn and winter impact and for the wildlife.

Divide perennials, plant trees, shrubs and hedging and sow winter salads

Carry out autumn lawn care and make a leaf mould.

Protect tender plants and vulnerable pots with bubble wrap

Prune roses to prevent wind rock and apple and pear trees-in November when dormant.

Gather berries, seed heads, catkins, and ornamental twigs to make Christmas decorations

If you remember to collect the sloes, sit back and enjoy your sloe gin at Christmas.
