

Lock your car, remove your valuables

'FIVE seconds is all it takes to steal your valuables from an unlocked car' – that's the message

from Lancashire Constabulary as they launch an awareness campaign to encourage motorists

to lock up. Motorists also need to be aware that some insurance companies may not pay out for claims when the vehicle has been left insecure – they risk losing not only their car but also being forced to pay for a new one and higher premiums in the future.

In 2012 over two thousand unlocked cars were targeted by thieves in Lancashire. This is 25.7 per cent of the 8,748 vehicle crimes reported across the county.

New Bowling Clubhouse; Sport England has now confirmed additional funding for the design and construction of the new bowling clubhouse, the planning application has been submitted to Chorley Borough Council and we hope to have the building open for use during May.

The total cost of the project will be £58,562 of which £52,942 will be provided by Sport England through the Parish Council. The remaining money, will be raised by Bretherton Bowling Club from its own funds. To help raise the additional funds, the Bowling Club is inviting local businesses to sponsor the club in return for an advertisement in the new building. Gardening advice from Marguerite; With Easter early this year (Good Friday 29th March), the four day break is an ideal opportunity to get started in the Garden and lay good foundations for the gardening months ahead.

One job that a lot of gardeners worry about is pruning but don't hold back, a plant that is properly pruned will be healthier and March is a key time for pruning plants that are grown for late summer flowers (Buddleia, Fuchsia, Caryopteris, Lavatera, Clematis) and those with colourful winter stems – Cornus, Salix & Rubus. You can also prune roses if not done earlier. All these should be hard pruned back to 30 cm above ground after corrective pruning i.e. taking out any stems that are Dead, Damaged, Dying or Diseased.



Garden jobs for Spring

Put herbaceous plant supports in position

Sow new lawns & bare patches when the soil has warmed up and treat existing lawns with weed & feed & mow as necessary

Weed feed & mulch established & newly planted plants

Regularly hoe off or hand weed annual weeds

During dry weather make sure all plants are adequately watered.

Sow annual seeds

Plant trees shrubs climbers & herbaceous perennials

Sow perennial seeds in March to ensure first year flowering

Propagate climbers & shrubs by layering & herbaceous perennials by division

Plant up containers, keeping tender plants in greenhouse until hardened off

Plant out tougher annuals such as sweet peas
