Bretherton Primary School-news from the Headteacher-Nick Ward

We live our lives through our Christian values: Friendship, Hope, Humility, Compassion, Courage, Truthfulness, Thankfulness and Respect.

Our new building is fantastic and it has made such an impact on the learning spaces we have in school. We can't imagine school without it!

We welcomed an artist from London, Christy Avraam, into school to work with **all** of our children to create a large mosaic for our new building entitled 'God created them all'. The design was based on a picture by Lily Hart in Class 3. All of our children in Y2-6 submitted a design and Lily's was chosen to be used. 'Figures' from Hollie Dockney's design have been incorporated too. We had a lot of fun creating the mosaic and it looks stunning.

Easter was celebrated in many different ways in school. Class 2 led a lovely worship on Easter - it was such a special time. We also talked about Easter symbols in church with Rev. David on a lovely sunny morning. We had a lot of fun with our egg rolling competition - congratulations to the champions. Our school council raised a staggering £257 with their Easter egg raffle - half of the money will be used to continue our sponsorship of Anesu through Action Aid and the other half will be spent on playground equipment.

Thanks to an 'Awards for All' grant we now have a much improved adventure trail on the school field. It has been used really well already and the children have demonstrated excellent behaviour whilst on the equipment.

Agape is a special communion service for children, which we have introduced in school this year. Rev. David worked with Y6 and the children in Classes 3 and 4 had a very special Agape service in school. This is something which we will be extending to the whole school and parents in the future.

The Olympics is featuring heavily in our curriculum this term. Each class will be exploring the topic and we have had some super theme days too. These have included an RE 'Who came first?' day; an Olympics play in a day; a Junior Chefs superfood challenge and an Olympics torch procession. It has been a very exciting time!

We continue to live by our Mission Statement at school: Learning together, growing together, achieving together, caring together within our Christian family. PACT MEETINGS

Fortunately, there has been very little reported crime in Bretherton and the surrounding villages in the last few months and what has been reported has been of a relatively minor nature. However, the police have advised that with summer almost with us, that we should all take extra care with home security. Windows left open in the summer heat (assuming we are talking about England!) are an open invitation to opportunistic thieves and if a window does need to stay open for ventilation purposes, please lock it in a partly open manner if at all possible. Equally so, quite often people are having BBQ's around the rear of the house and leaving side or others doors unlocked - again, an open invitation to thieves. Ensure valuables are locked away at night, that cars are not left unlocked, that garden equipment is put away and ensure that any sheds/outbuildings are properly and effectively secured. If we take care and are vigilant, we can keep thieves out of our village! On another note, I would be interested to hear your views about the level of community policing, bearing in mind that I cannot remember the last time I saw any sort of police officer walking the beat in Bretherton.

ICE - 'In Case of Emergency'

We all carry our mobile phones with names & numbers stored in its memory but nobody, other than ourselves, knows which of these numbers belong to our closest family or friends. But If we were to be involved in an accident or were taken ill, the people attending us would have our mobile phone but wouldn't know who to call Hence this 'ICE' (In Case of Emergency) Campaign. All you need to do is store the number of a contact person or persons who should be contacted during emergency under the name 'ICE' (In Case o f Emergency). In an emergency situation, Emergency Service personnel and hospital Staff would be able to quickly contact the right person by simply dialing the number you have stored as 'ICE.'



For more than one contact name simply enter ICE1, ICE2 and ICE3

Barbecue Safety

Barbecues are involved in many hundreds of accidents that occur in the garden each year.

The most common types of barbecue-related accidents are:

Burn/scald/other injury related to fire or flame - 800

Cut/tear by sharp edges - 200.

The vast majority of barbecue accidents (1,400) happened in a home setting, with 300 occurring in a public place.

The number of accidents usually increases if we have a hot summer. Some of the accidents lead to very serious burns, usually as a result of using an accelerant such as petrol to light the fuel.

Advice and information

Barbecues should be fun, and will be safe if you prepare properly and take the following precautions;

When choosing a barbecue, stability is essential - ensure the one you choose is strong and sturdy

Check your barbecue is in good condition (particularly if you have not used it for some time) and look for loose or damaged parts that may need adjustment or repair

Consider the location - level ground, away from fences, sheds and overhanging trees, which

have been known to catch fire

Never light a barbecue in an enclosed space

Prepare the barbecue early to ensure it is at the right temperature by the time you want to cook

Particular care should be taken in hot, dry weather to reduce the risk of starting a forest Or grass fire

Never pour petrol, meths or other accelerants on to a barbecue. Some of the most serious barbecue-related accidents happen when people do this and the barbecue "explodes" in their face

Use long-handled tools

Be careful of steam when opening foil parcels

Remember that the metal parts of a barbecue can become hot - don't try to move it until It has cooled down

Don't leave children unsupervised near a barbecue

Make sure the barbecue is fully extinguished before you leave it

Take care when getting rid of a disposable barbecue, or barbecue coals -ensure they have cooled down before placing them in a bin.



Gardening news from Marguerite

Has summer arrived in May? Finally after months of cold & rain, the sun has emerged. A few tips for you to make sure your plants can cope with a heatwave –If plants such as Japanese Acers or evergreens start to lose their leaves they are defoliating to maintain water to their rootball. Don't panic, as well as watering the base of the plant, use the spray attachment on your hosepipe & spray over the stems and branches of the leaves. The water will be taken in by the plant & it will re-leaf. Try not to plant new plants when the weather is extremely hot but if there is no option when you plant new trees & shrubs or move any mature plants, insert some plastic piping at the back of the plants & water down the pipe. This ensures that the water goes to the root rather than losing much to run off on the dry soil.

Essential Tasks for June and July

Trees Shrubs Flowers & Climbers

Deadhead annuals, perennials & roses to prolong flowering
Keep all containers adequately moist
Pick flowers such as sweet peas & dahlias to prolong flowers
Take semi ripe cuttings

Lawns

Mow regularly, paying special attention to newer lawns

Herbs & vegetables

Keep vegetables well watered and trim herbs to keep them bushy

Fruit

Support potentially overladen branches on fruit trees

Roses.

Check for blackspot

Essential Tasks of the Month – August

Trees, Shrubs & Climbers

Water as necessary, concentrating on newer plantings
Keep weeds down to minimise competition
Prune rambler roses as soon as flowering is over
Finish summer pruning wisteria

Flowers

Weed regularly in beds & borders
Deadhead summer bedding plants & feed those in containers with a high potash fertiliser
Order bulbs from catalogues

Lawns

Mow the lawn as necessary, keeping the cut quite high if the weather is dry

Herbs & Vegetables

Harvest crops regularly & promptly
Hoe off weeds between rows regularly

Fruit

Finish pruning cordon apples & pears
Plant new strawberry plants in open ground or containers

Ponds & Water Features

Pick or cut off deteriorating pond & marginal plant leaves

Enjoy your garden and take pleasure from all your hard work

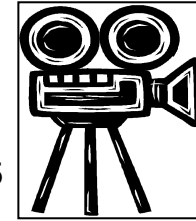

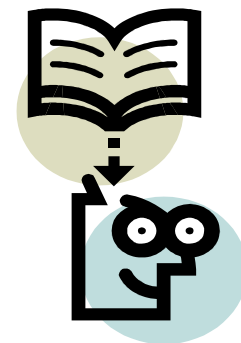
